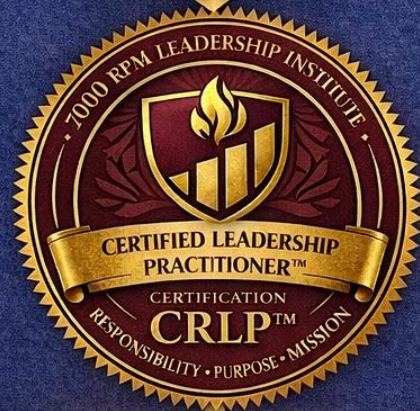

The Institute Charter™ establishes the founding principles, purpose, and governing authority of the 7000 RPM Leadership Institute™. Institute Curriculum

The 7000 RPM Leadership Formation Journey™

The curriculum of the 7000 RPM Leadership Institute™ is designed as a structured leadership formation process that guides participants through the progressive development of character, relational intelligence, and leadership responsibility. Rather than presenting leadership as a collection of isolated skills, the curriculum approaches leadership as a disciplined journey of personal formation and organizational stewardship.

Participants move through a series of learning modules that progressively strengthen leadership awareness, leadership alignment, and leadership influence. Each module introduces foundational leadership concepts while encouraging participants to examine their own leadership patterns and decision-making habits.

The curriculum is divided into five major stages that reflect the developmental progression of leadership maturity:

1. Leadership Awareness
2. Leadership Alignment
3. Leadership Formation
4. Leadership Application
5. Leadership Multiplication

Each stage contains several modules designed to deepen the leader's understanding of influence, responsibility, and service.

Module 1

Leadership Identity and Awareness

Learning Objective

Participants will explore the nature of leadership influence and develop an understanding of their own leadership identity.

Core Teaching

Leadership begins with identity. Every leader carries an internal understanding of who they are and what they believe their role to be within an organization or community. This identity shapes the way leaders interpret challenges, make decisions, and interact with others.

Many leadership failures occur not because leaders lack intelligence or skill, but because they lack clarity regarding their identity as leaders. When leaders define themselves primarily through authority or position, they often focus on maintaining control rather than cultivating responsibility.

The Institute teaches that leadership identity must be grounded in stewardship. Leaders are entrusted with influence not for personal advancement but for the development and well-being of those they guide.

Understanding leadership identity allows leaders to approach their responsibilities with humility, discipline, and purpose.

Application

Participants are asked to write a brief reflection describing how their understanding of leadership has shaped their decisions in previous leadership experiences.

Module 2

The Responsibility of Leadership

Learning Objective

Participants will understand the moral and relational responsibility associated with leadership influence.

Core Teaching

Leadership influence carries responsibility because the decisions of leaders shape the environment in which others live and work. Organizational culture, team morale, and institutional direction are often reflections of leadership behavior.

Responsible leadership therefore requires discipline and humility. Leaders must continually evaluate how their decisions affect the people entrusted to their guidance.

Within the 7000 RPM framework, leadership responsibility is understood as stewardship. Leaders are caretakers of the mission, guardians of organizational culture, and facilitators of collective progress.

Leaders who embrace this responsibility cultivate trust and credibility. Leaders who ignore it often undermine the very organizations they seek to lead.

Leadership Reflection

Application

Participants identify one leadership decision they must make in their current environment and evaluate how that decision may affect others.

Module 3

Understanding the Leadership Engine™

Learning Objective

Participants will understand the internal elements that sustain leadership stability.

Core Teaching

The Leadership Engine Model™ illustrates the internal alignment required for sustained leadership influence. Just as a mechanical engine converts energy into movement, the leadership engine converts character and vision into organizational momentum.

The leadership engine is composed of several key elements:

Character
Vision
Discipline
Service
Influence
Culture
Legacy

When these elements operate together, leadership becomes stable and sustainable. When they fall out of alignment, leadership influence begins to weaken.

Leaders must therefore cultivate each of these components through intentional reflection and disciplined leadership practice.

Module 4

The Leadership Gates Doctrine™ explains how influence enters a leader's life and shapes leadership judgment.

The Eye Gate represents what leaders observe and allow to shape their perception of reality.

The Ear Gate represents the voices and information leaders allow to influence their decisions.

The Mouth Gate represents the communication through which leaders shape organizational culture.

Leaders who fail to guard these gates often allow distorted information, destructive voices, or careless communication to undermine leadership effectiveness.

Guarding the gates protects leadership clarity and strengthens leadership credibility.

Leadership Reflection

What types of information most strongly influence your leadership decisions?

How do you evaluate the reliability of the voices you listen to?

Application

Participants evaluate their current sources of influence and identify areas where greater discernment may be necessary.

Module 5

Cultural Stewardship and the Salt Principle™

Learning Objective

Participants will understand how leadership influence shapes organizational culture.

Core Teaching

The Salt Doctrine™ teaches that leadership influence preserves and strengthens organizational culture. Just as salt historically preserved food and enhanced flavor, leadership influence preserves values and strengthens the environment in which individuals operate.

Leaders function as cultural stewards. Their actions communicate what is acceptable, what is valued, and what behaviors are encouraged within the organization.

Healthy cultures are not accidental. They emerge through consistent leadership decisions that reinforce trust, responsibility, and shared purpose.

Leadership Reflection

How would you describe the culture of the organization or community you serve?

What leadership behaviors contribute most strongly to that culture?

Application

Participants identify one cultural practice within their organization that could be strengthened through intentional leadership action.

Module 6

Recognizing the Collapse Spiral™

Learning Objective

Participants will understand the stages through which leadership drift occurs.

Core Teaching

The Leadership Collapse Spiral™ describes how leadership instability often emerges gradually through small compromises rather than sudden failure.

Leaders may begin by overlooking minor issues or neglecting disciplined practices. Over time these compromises accumulate and erode leadership credibility.

Understanding the collapse spiral allows leaders to identify early warning signs and restore alignment before damage becomes irreversible.

Leadership Reflection

What early warning signs indicate that leadership alignment may be weakening?

Application

Participants examine a leadership situation where small compromises led to larger organizational consequences.

Module 7

Sustaining Leadership Influence

Learning Objective

Participants will understand the Endurance Leadership Cycle™.

Core Teaching

The Endurance Leadership Cycle™ describes the pattern through which leaders sustain influence across seasons of responsibility.

Rooting
Stability
Fruitfulness
Reproduction

Through these stages leaders develop resilience and cultivate future leaders who can continue the mission.

Module 8

Leadership Multiplication

Learning Objective

Participants will understand how effective leaders develop future leaders.

Core Teaching

The final stage of leadership maturity involves multiplication. Leaders who reach this stage recognize that the ultimate measure of leadership is not personal achievement but the development of others.

Multiplying leadership influence ensures that organizations continue to thrive even as leadership transitions

Module 9

Leadership Discernment and Decision Making

Learning Objective

Participants will develop the capacity to evaluate complex leadership situations and make decisions that reflect wisdom, responsibility, and alignment with organizational purpose.

Core Teaching

Leadership often requires decisions in circumstances where the correct course of action is not immediately clear. Leaders must frequently balance competing priorities, limited information, and the expectations of individuals who hold differing perspectives.

Discernment is therefore a critical leadership capability. Discernment refers to the ability to interpret circumstances accurately, recognize underlying motivations, and anticipate the consequences of potential decisions.

The 7000 RPM Leadership Institute™ teaches that discernment develops through the disciplined integration of observation, reflection, and ethical judgment. Leaders must learn to pause long enough to evaluate situations carefully before acting.

Effective discernment requires leaders to ask several critical questions:

- What is the true issue in this situation?
- Who will be affected by this decision?
- Does this decision align with the mission and values of the organization?
- What unintended consequences might emerge from this course of action?

Leaders who cultivate discernment avoid impulsive reactions and instead guide organizations through thoughtful and responsible decision-making.

Leadership Reflection

Think of a leadership decision you made that had unexpected consequences.

What information or perspective might have helped you evaluate that situation differently?

Application

Participants analyze a complex leadership scenario and discuss the possible outcomes of different leadership decisions.

Module 10

Leadership Influence and Organizational Culture

Learning Objective

Participants will understand how leadership behavior shapes the culture of organizations and communities.

Core Teaching

Organizational culture emerges from patterns of leadership behavior over time. Culture is not created through mission statements alone but through the daily actions and decisions of leaders.

Leaders communicate organizational priorities through what they reward, what they tolerate, and what they correct. These signals influence how individuals within the organization interpret expectations and interact with one another.

Within the 7000 RPM framework, leaders are understood to be **cultural stewards**. Their behavior establishes the tone for collaboration, accountability, and trust.

Healthy organizational cultures are characterized by:

- Clarity of purpose
- Mutual respect among individuals
- Shared responsibility for outcomes

Mentorship addresses this challenge by intentionally transferring knowledge, experience, and leadership perspective to emerging leaders. Mentorship relationships create environments where individuals can ask questions, reflect on leadership challenges, and receive guidance from experienced leaders.

Within the Institute framework, mentorship is understood as an extension of servant leadership. Leaders who mentor others invest their time and insight in the development of individuals who will eventually guide organizations themselves.

Effective mentorship involves:

- Listening attentively to the experiences of emerging leaders
- Offering guidance based on experience and reflection

Leadership multiplication ensures that organizations continue to grow and thrive even as leadership transitions occur. It reflects the understanding that leadership influence should extend beyond the lifespan of a single leader's tenure.

Multiplication occurs when leaders cultivate environments where individuals are empowered to develop their own leadership capabilities. This process requires humility, patience, and the willingness to share responsibility.

Legacy therefore becomes the natural outcome of leadership multiplication. Leaders who prioritize the development of others leave behind organizations that are stronger, more resilient, and better prepared for future challenges.

Within the Institute framework, legacy is defined not by titles or achievements but by the continued flourishing of individuals and communities influenced by responsible leadership.
